



## Sport Premium Report – September 2015

The aim at Birch Hill is to ensure that all teachers are able to provide high-quality PE and games lessons. In addition, we want all children to have the opportunity to participate in a variety of sports competitions.

The Bracknell Forest School Sport Support Initiative has given us:

- a place at the Annual PE Conference – strategic focus based on national and local issues
- attendance at three twilight PE meetings aimed at PE Subject Leaders
- Access to a 1/2 day 'whole school' session in school with a focus on the PE curriculum
- Access to additional sport specific training secured through National Governing Bodies
- Sharing of local network and teachers' subject expertise within Bracknell Forest through two network sessions
- The co-ordination of coaches who support festival delivery eg Tennis, Y2 golf
- Access to programmes for gifted and talented children and young people
- Quality assurance of sports companies wishing to deliver PE and sport in schools
- Delivery of an annual PE and School Sport Calendar
- Access to high quality competitions from Y1 – Y6 including Young People in Sport festivals
- Organised and co-ordinated locally led School Games competitions
- Multi-Skill opportunities for pupils in KS1
- Co-ordination of competitions beyond School Games ie Y2 golf, football and Kickstart
- Support for schools with data collection methods to support OFSTED criteria and Kite Mark applications
- Support for schools to self review Physical Education and School Sport and develop a whole school physical literacy plan
- Access to additional coaching secured through the School Sport Network

- Providing opportunities for school/club links
- Support for schools with externally funded programmes ie health related projects
- Inclusion of Bracknell Forest communication on sporting opportunities locally and/or nationally
- Access to an equipment library
- Access to further Olympic legacy opportunities

In addition, at a cost of £1000:

- Three teachers from the school are taking part in a professional development programme (Real PE) provided by Create Development
- Three opportunities for staff members to be trained at YR, KS1 and KS2, or one member in all three key stages
- Three days of training (YR, KS1 and KS2) through the academic year
- Staff will receive schemes of work (one each for EY, KS1, KS2) which contains a year's worth of lessons, supporting resources which aligns to the new national curriculum

#### **Assessment of the impact of these initiatives:**

- Gymnastics training with Local Authority Staff
- Teachers are more confident to use equipment safely and more creatively
- Children are having more of a wider range of activities in gymnastics

#### **Real PE**

- More teachers are confident to execute progressive, inclusive and creative lessons
- Children are more engaged and are building confidence in lessons and with skills
- Children are not 'forgetting' their PE kits or avoiding sessions.

#### **Priorities for 2015/16**

- Continue with Bracknell Forest PE and Sport Support Initiative
- Continue to support teachers CPD through REAL PE
- Review playground routines and provision
  - Provide training for Lunchtime Controllers
  - Leadership & Volunteering opportunities
    - Playground Leaders
    - Sport competition Leaders
  - Purchase new equipment
  - Provide specialist support (skipping etc)
- Review sporting competition calendar to ensure we enter as many events as possible
- Swimming - Year 5 that do not achieve 25 metre goal will go again later on in the year to complete training
