Create a character profile for them. *	Create a meal from another part of the world/Britain. Write a recipe for your meal.
Humanities and Citizenship - History, Geography, RE, Cultural, visits	Ask your parents about a historical event that they remember.	Find out which town Bracknell is twinned with. Locate both on a map.	Draw/write about the event your parent explained. (linked to 1 point challenge)	What can you find out about the town Bracknell is Twinned with?
Science and Technology - Science, DT, Eco issues	Find a family member/friend who has moved away from home. What were their reasons for moving?	Find out and compare the climate of 5 countries.	Plant some some seed (e.g. runner bean/broad beans) and monitor the growth. Can you draw the life cycle of your plant?	Create a vehicle that can be used to travel around the world in 20 days.
Creative Arts – Art, Design, Drama, Music, Dance	Create your own flag for a country of your choice.	Research and perform/teach a cultural dance from another part of Britain/the world.	Demonstrate the water cycle. This can be done using drawings, performance art or a model	Research and make a family crest. Do you already have one? What do all of the parts mean?
Maths & Problem Solving - Maths, Thinking Skills, Logic, Problem solving	What is the time difference between Bracknell and the town it is twinned with?	How far apart are Bracknell and the town it is twinned with? What would the total distance travelled be if you visited?	Measure the height of 5 plants found in the local environment. Record your results in a bar chart.	Conduct a survey to find out what your family's favourite dish is. Present your findings in a graph.

Using the columns, choose an activity from the grid each week. In order to ensure that your child benefits from a rounded experience, we advise that they choose a different subject each week. By the end of the term your child would have earned **10 points** over the half term and a house point. You must have **evidence** of **all** the activities you choose.
